As a teenager, Alfred Allan Lewis was discovered by a talent scout for Mae West and played the Champ in her production of "Diamond Lil." After appearing in two additional Broadway productions, he decided acting was not for him. He subsequently worked in the press department for Roger Stevens and Robert Whitehead Broadway productions and did personal publicity for Count Basie, Eydie Gorme, and Fats Domino among others. He was later advance manager for a European tour of distinguished African American artists in Harold Arlen's "Blues Opera" for which the young Quincy Jones was musical director and Donald MacKayle did the choreography. Lewis was short listed for a Peabody Award for his radio play, "A tribute to Eugene O'Neill." He also wrote episodes for the television soaps, "Edge of Night," "The Doctors," and "Dark Shadows." He has written three plays, produced in both England and the United States.

Among his published books are: "Miss Elizabeth Arden," "Man of the World," "The Evidence Never Lies," and "Ladies and Not So Gentle Women." The latter became a play that was produced at the New Theatre in Coral Gables. Mr. Lewis is a strong supporter of the arts in South Florida including the Florida Grand Opera, New World School of the Arts, Florida International University, and the Inter-American Choreographic Institute among many others.

Men Who Dance is a project of the Inter-American Choreographic Institute (ICI). The festival was launched in November of 2020 and made history as the first dance concert back to a major theater, the Broward Center for the Performing Arts, since all theaters closed in March 2020 due to the COVID pandemic. Men Who Dance brought together several major companies and guest artists from South Florida and presented a full concert to a CDC approved audience seating plan.

Men Who Dance is not a competition. It is a showcase of exceptional talent, a global occasion for dance and cultural exchange. We have been honored to feature highly respected artists and companies from the United States, and this year we are expanding our reach to include extraordinarily talented artists from around the world.

The presence of men on the concert stage, theater, commercial and video production, has grown exponentially. Men are no longer just the frame that supports the picture but rather many times assume the center of the subject matter. Themes around men have become diverse, personal, and multicultural, showcasing not only their strengths but also their vulnerabilities. However, challenges remain. Even though the rigorous physical demands of dance are akin to an Olympic sport, young men who were drawn to the art form are very seldom encouraged by their families, friends, or peers to pursue their interest.

Breaking New Ground



Once again men who dance becomes the platform to launch new choreographic works based on the idea of exploring Myriad definitions of masculinity. This year we are pleased to have the following.

Randolph Ward: Through the use of African, Jazz, and hip-hop dance styles infused with nuances of HBCU (historically Black colleges and universities) band culture. This male trio pays homage to the cultural rhythmic richness of Africa and the vitality of African American culture and its influence on the world.

Vladmir Issaev: An homage to this great Venezuelan composer who is included in the Venezuelan Encyclopedia of Music where I'm honored to share a space as part of the history of the development of the arts in Venezuela. I feel very proud to present this world premiere at MWD 2022, a Joropo in Onda Nueva, with elements of Ballet

Ariel Rose: "Avision of masculinity absent shame nor fear; propelled by the sound of the divine".

Enrique Villacreses: Fifth Moon, explores an intermediate, transitional, liminal state between death and rebirth. Where these lost souls that are stuck in this dimension, try to find a resolution to their lives in order to pass on to the next one, using one another in the process.

Diego Salterini: DNM presents a sneak peek of "Clara" an adult contemporary adaptation of the Nutcracker charting the journey of a young woman, exploring and experiencing the exotic, the unknown and the forbidden. The full ballet will premiere December 10 at Miami Theater Center.

Nicolas Berrueta & Fabian Leguizmon: A poetic body that seeks to heal its history and find freedom on a journey towards the sun that illuminates it.





The Inter-American Choreographic Institute's mission is to "promote and nurture" the creation and/or presentation of artistic or choreographic works that reflect the cultural paradigms and consciousness of the Americas: raise its national and international importance; and promote cultural economic development through public-private partnerships."

Its goals include to encourage, support, and create national and Inter-American collaborations between cultural organizations, artists, art presenters and others, that promote the arts through education, artistic development and support, public performances, engage in community outreach, and sponsor sustainable arts related

ICI is currently operating within 5 Latin-American countries, including Brazil, where it has an official charter. ICI just produced this September "Carnival of the Animals-The Swansong" in Asuncion, Paraguay with sponsorship from over 12 governmental, public, and private organizations including production support from Miami City Ballet where the ballet was first commissioned and presented.



The Inter-American Choreographic Institute is honored to partner with South Florida's newest and most exciting arts organization, Sanctuary of the Arts. Founded by visionary philanthropists Mr. Mike and Dr. Margaret Eidson, the organization is an innovative artist led institution that focuses on presenting world-class entertainment to South Florida communities from both national and international artists; provide local and regional arts organizations with an affordable space to present their programs and develop strategies to increase audiences; encourage, nourish, and present the next generation of young artists with opportunities to present their works, and develop their artistry.

The organization operates within an expansive arts campus, at First Church of Christ Scientist, Coral Gables, that includes that includes three historic designated properties which house two professional size studios, a 314-seat Concert Hall, classrooms, and offices in the heart of Coral Gables. Since it's official Grand Opening in April 2022, Sanctuary of the Arts has presented over 30 concerts in music, dance, and literature.






In 2021 the Inter-American Choreographic Institute launched an extension to the festival: Men Who Dance Global. In each country, ICI organizes with local dance companies, choreographers, and other cultural organizations a three-day master class workshop for advanced, apprentice-level, and professional dancers, with an opportunity to be selected to audition to represent their cities and countries at the Men Who Dance Festival at the Broward Center for the Performing Arts.

The workshop is free for the dancers and is also meant as an opportunity for company directors to find talent for their own companies. The occasion is also a forum for professional networking and has resulted in numerous professional collaborations.

DNM produces Daniel Lewis Dance Sampler and has been presented in 16 states and on 3 continents. The company made its debut in December 1997 celebrating its 25th anniversary during this running season. The company repertoire includes works by such classical ballet masters and works by Artistic Director Vladimir Issaev and contemporary guest choreographers, performing a full season annually in Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach counties, as well as internationally. The repertoire includes ballets of high caliber and international reputation. Since its inception, the company has been invited to perform at international dance festivals and galas in Poland, Peru, Denmark, Luxembourg, Germany, Indonesia, Mexico, Japan and Malaysia. They have been proud participants at the Miami Dance Sampler Festival since 2013, Men Who Dance 2021, the Miami International Festival since 2018 and the International Ballet Festival in Havana, Cuba, in 2016 and 2017. Educational outreach programs include Dancing with Disabilities, Arts Ballet Goes to School and the ClassicalBallet Seminar of Russian technique, attracting national and international students every summer. The company continues to work in collaboration with Dance Now! Ensemble, The Opera Atelier MIBC and supports organizations such as UNICEF USA (Dance for Peace); Pridelines, a LGBTQ organization; and U.S. veterans among others. 






A non-profit organization, CCBM was founded in 2006 by Pedro Pablo Peña and is solely dedicated to performing and preserving the classical ballet repertoire as exemplified by the Cuban ballet tradition. One of CCBM's goals is to establish a permanent classical ballet company and school that will preserve and further the tradition of the Cuban Classical School of ballet outside of Cuba. Currently under the artistic direction of Eriberto Jimenez, the Company has a regular yearly season that includes four programs presented in several venues throughout Miami-Dade County, featuring guest Cuban principal dancers and soloists as well as CCBM corps the ballet.

(MMC) Miami Movement Collective is the collaborative effort of multidisciplinary Miami-based freelance artists who view this city as a flourishing and abundant playground. Their main mission is to coalesce the various crafts, practices, and studies of individual artists in the Miami area to forge a unifying identity. As a collective they







FGO was founded in 1941 as Greater Miami Opera and merged with The Opera Guild of Fort Lauderdale, Inc. in 1994. As Florida's premier opera company, it presents standard repertoire, contemporary works, new commissions, and original productions — all featuring projected translations in English and Spanish. The mainstage operas of the season include Domenico Cimarosa's El matrimonio secreto, sung in Spanish translation (Nov. 12 - 15, 2022), Giacomo Puccini's Gianni Schicchi and Michael Ching's Buoso's Ghost (Jan. 28 - Feb.11, 2023), Giacomo Puccini's Tosca (Mar. 18 - Apr. 15, 2023), and Gioacchino Rossini's The Barber of Seville (Apr.29 - May 20, 2023).

The mission of New Canon Chamber Collective is to amplify the voices of Black and Brown composers and artists, while helping to evolve the classical music canon. We believe that by amplifying the voices of Black and Brown artists and composers, we empower the field of classical music to be more reflective of the rich diversity in our communities. This contribution will not only evolve the canon for our immediate community but serve the entire field while empowering underrepresented artists of color from being heard, seen, and performed. The work that we do is community focused to our core--from giving voice and equitable pay to Black and Brown classical music artists and composers, providing quality educational programing, to connecting with community arts organizations. We believe that creating a space for Black and Brown people to see themselves reflected in classical music opens another door of possibility and pride in one's cultural identity and makes our community stronger as a whole. We believe that students who are exposed to our work will feel seen and imagine themselves outside of the stereotypes and barriers placed put on them by a system designed to marginalize them. New Canon is not constrained to the image of what a "traditional" chamber music ensemble is supposed to look like. We are intentionalconscionable about the way we collaborate and program our concerts. We are heavily rooted in our community and partner with local arts organizations. Our members reflect the makeup of South Florida, and our organization is led by a Black woman. We believe that all of these combined lived experiences allow us to have a very unique insight into ways of dismantling harmful, exclusive, elitist spaces built around orchestral music.





An initiative of Ray Sullivan Dance, presents a unique platform for inclusion and art for social change, with a focus on Queer Tango for the LGBTQ+ and immigrant communities. The initiative has presented numerous events, performances, milongas, prácticas, and more than 300 classes in Miami, with yearlong presence in Argentina in addition to effecting a strong vision of global connection. The team has participated in events and festivals in Argentina, Chile, Paraguay, Uruguay, Canada, Mexico, Germany, France, Italy, New York, Chicago, and Miami, among others.
